Vice Chair: I made the summary of the Subcommittees email forum and the questions I asked of some groups from last year. They will be sent out with the minutes and posted on the website.

I did not attend any subcommittees this month. I was in contact with several of the subcommittees and am pleased to report that there are no problems or issues to address.

I have updated the NAWs meeting list again. Please, if your group is changing locations, opening a new meeting, or closing a meeting let me and Amber (Communications) know so the meeting lists can be updated in both websites.

In Closing, I want to gently remind all trusted servants of some of Concepts of Service. Concept 7 says, "All members of a service body bear substantial responsibility for that body's decisions and should be allowed to fully participate in its decision-making processes." We need to work as a team and not make decisions alone without the rest of the team. Concept 8 says, "Our service structure depends on the integrity and effectiveness of our communications." We need to openly communicate with each other; we cannot work as a team or even have NA Unity without communicating with each other. Concept 9 says, "All elements of our service structure have the responsibility to carefully consider all viewpoints in their decision-making processes." We need consider the viewpoints of those that may disagree with us when we are in the process of making a decision. Maybe one of the most important concepts is Concept 3, "The NA groups delegate to the service structure the authority necessary to fulfill the responsibilities assigned to it." This is a reminder that we as trusted servants of the Area are here to serve the groups. It is easy for us to decide to do something because we think it is best for the groups, all the while not realizing that we are serving ourselves or our ego not the groups. We need to be careful not to take advantage of the authority the groups have given us to fulfill the responsibilities assigned to us. When working as a team we are less likely to do this. Just a few things I thought we as trusted servants might need reminded of.

RCM 1: Region met Jan 19th in Albuquerque. Six out of six areas were represented: ABQ, Bosque, El Paso, 4 Corners, LOMA, and NNM.

We agreed to present brief reports and focus on The Planning Session scheduled for that meeting.

Treasurer reported a balance of \$6931.30. Donations from the areas totaled approx. \$800.00. This included the \$207.90 from GAASCNA. The treasurer has discovered that taxes were not paid for 2011 or 2012, and will rectify that.

The current chair's term is complete in March. He is willing to serve another term, but Region welcomes nominations from the fellowship.

LOMA announced the annual Full Moon Campout in White Sands, June 22. Fliers will be available soon.

There is a Valentine's Day dance tonight from 5:30-12 midnight in Santa Fe, at the Christ Lutheran Church at St Michael's Drive and Old Pecos Trail.

Region voted to fund RD and AD to World Service Zonal Forum.

Regional Phonelines: moving forward, with Paul S contacting individual areas for plans for switch-over.

We will be electing a Regional Phonelines Chair at the March meeting.

Elections: We elected Luke M as new Webmaster.

The next Regional meeting will occur in El Paso at the RGRCA. We meet Sunday March 17th, sometime between 11 am and 1 pm.

Free Conference Calls-

The PR Committee met on February 2nd at the Frontier. We are still without a permanent meeting place. We will meet on February 23rd at Annapurna at 1:30 PM, across Silver from the Options meeting.

We continue to be committed to working together with the Bosque area. We rescheduled our meeting last month and it hit on a day when their PR chair couldn't join us, but we hope to coordinate efforts going forward.

One of our committee members was approached to participate in a survey of veterans in NA which is being conducted by a major university with the cooperation of NAWS. He brought this to the PR committee meeting for discussion. We had no problem with it and were mostly enthusiastic about seeing the results and reviewing them for possible use in PR efforts, but no action items for our committee came out of this discussion.

We discussed the area inventory from a PR Committee point of view, focusing on the general question, "What issues do we see that need to be discussed or addressed by area?" A few different versions of the area split issue were the main topic that came up. The fact that there are two areas potentially being in contact with the same people around town who wish to have a relationship of cooperation with NA is, in the opinion of a number of our committee members, a significant PR issue. At a minimum, it calls for cooperation between the two areas.

Our literature workgroup point person was out of town during our meeting, so we didn't get a report this month, but the efforts to keep racks stocked at various locations around town continues.

No professional contacts or e-mail exchanges occurred this month. Those still in the planning stage include:

- the "Head to Toe" conference coming up in May, where we are a presenter and will have a booth,
- NM Job Corps, who would like to have some regular NA presence there,
- Bernalillo County, whose substance abuse programs are undergoing a change in administration and focus, so we want to be sure they have good information about and contacts with NA,

Sandoval County, which is in our service area and with whom we have had no contact to date

Luke M. has been made point person of our website workgroup. He was elected to the I.T. position at the regional meeting this month as well, so we are in a good position now to implement this area's requests and ideas on the website.

Guideline Requirements

ADMINISTRATIVE TRUSTED SERVANTS

Administrative Trusted Servants are responsible for attending all GAASC meetings and submitting reports including a detailed accounting of any monthly expenditure.

Administrative Trusted Servants shall refer to Article X: Spiritual Guidance for documents that define the principles of operation for their respective positions.

In the event that the Area Chairperson is unable to perform his or her duties, the following people, in this order, will facilitate the GAASC meeting.

- Vice-Chair
- Historian
- RCM1
- RCM2
- Secretary
- Treasurer

Regional Committee Member 2 (RCM2): This is a two-year commitment with the first year spent becoming familiar with the duties of RCM while attending all GAASC and Regional Service Committee meetings, and the second year spent as RCM1. A minimum of two years of continuous abstinence from all drugs suggested.

Regional Committee Member 1 (RCM1): An RCM is to the GAASC what a GSR is to a Group.

- a. The RCM1 keeps the GAASC in touch with the larger world of NA by providing information on activities in neighboring areas, events sponsored by the regional committee, reports relevant to subcommittee affairs, and important issues being discussed at various levels of service.
- b. The primary responsibility of the RCM is to provide two-way communication between the GAASC and the rest of NA, particularly with neighboring areas.

- c. The RCM represents the GAASC group conscience at the regional level and provides the GAASC with the agenda of the upcoming RSC meetings.
- d. A minimum of three years continuous abstinence from all drugs and service experience as RCM2 is suggested.

Secretary: The Secretary (and Assistant Secretary) is

- a. Responsible for all GAASC correspondence including taking accurate minutes of all GAASC meetings and distributing minutes to all participants within ten days.
- b. In the absence of a Historian, the Secretary performs the duties listed under that position, as well.
- c. Participates in the quarterly audit of all Treasury records and accounts.
- d. A minimum one year of continuous abstinence from all drugs is suggested.

Historian: The Historian is responsible for maintaining GAASC files and archives as well as maintaining and understanding the documents listed in *Article X: Spiritual Guidance*.

- a. Maintains records of changes to the Guidelines and Major Motions¹, providing a complete updated version at the end of the term.
- b. Participates in the quarterly audit of all treasury records and accounts.
- c. A minimum three years of continuous abstinence from all drugs is suggested.

SUBCOMMITTEES

- A. It is the responsibility of the GAASC to support and maintain subcommittees.
- B. The GAASC has the responsibility to form additional subcommittees as the need arises.
- C. Proposals to create or dissolve standing subcommittees must be sent back to the groups, and then be approved by a two-thirds majority of the present voting members at the next GAASC.
- D. Ad-hoc subcommittees may be created by the GAASC Chairperson or a simple majority at any GAASC meeting to answer a question or take on special projects that are beyond the scope of our existing subcommittees. Will follow A Guide to Local Services and other NA-approved guidelines and handbooks. The GAASC Chairperson may appoint either the entire ad-hoc subcommittee or just a chairperson.
- E. Subcommittee Chairs are responsible for attending all GAASC meetings or sending an informed representative in their absence.
- F. Every subcommittee Chairperson is responsible for submitting written reports at all GAASC meetings, including a detailed listing of all monthly expenditures.
- G. Subcommittee Chairpersons do not vote at GAASC meetings.
- H. All subcommittees shall refer to Article X: Spiritual Guidance for related documents that define the principles of operation for their respective subcommittees.

¹ A “major motion” is any motion that changes guidelines or policy.

Outreach: The Outreach subcommittee visits isolated groups and ASC's; hosts workshops providing basic service and meeting information; and sponsors simple fellowship events.

Public Relations: The general mission of the PR subcommittee is to ensure that clear and accurate information about NA is available to the public.
